SCHOOL SPONSORSHIP PROJECT – Changes to the sponsorship project meant no fees were collected for the term that commenced at end of April. With Gift Aid and outside donations there was sufficient money in the fund to cover the last payment. Some children have left school and others have taken advantage of being sponsored to attend boarding school where they have meals provided. Margaret MacLaren, Sheena Stewart and Sheena's daughter Hannah will meet students during their visit to Malawi in September and will return with a clearer picture. They hope to take with them a good quantity of craft items (available in the Pound Shop) and children's clothes (for 2-5 year olds) contributions of these items may be left in the suitcase in the Stewart Hall for the next few Sundays. ## SYRIA

The following is an extract from a letter received Majed Tinawi from Syria who spoke at a Connect service some time ago. “*We have been helping a Syria doctor called, Moham Gdansk as a refugee almost a year ago. Mohammad has, now, been granted a political status in Poland recognised as a refugee. He was sharing his desire to get his own place to live and getting practical help to start submitting his medical qualifications so he could begin practising his profession as a doctor. He was sharing with us that the cost of translating and approving his papers by the authorities as well as medical language course, plus an exam fee at the University of Gdansk might add up to around £3000. Anna and I would be grateful, if you would, to join us as we pray that God will enable us to help Mohammad at this important stage in his life to support his goals. Best wishes and Christian love”*


