



## WELCOME TO WORSHIP

We are always happy to have visitors with us in Cregagh; and we welcome any who may be worshipping with us today. ## ORDER OF SERVICE

As from today we will be worshipping in the Allen Hall on Sundays during the refurbishment, and the normal format of our service is changed. There will be no Processional or Recessional hymns and all items of praise will be announced.

After the singing of the first hymn the congregation remains standing until the minister says "Let us pray"

The Offering is after the Sermon and is not announced. Those members sitting in the centre block of seats are asked to pass the Offering plate along each row from end to end. Hymn books are on the seats and the congregation is asked to leave them on the seat at the end of the service. Entrance to the Coffee Bar (Stewart Hall) is through the door to the left of the platform.
