### **REMEMBRANCE GIFT**



On this special day when we remember the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of WW1 we are delighted to announce that one of the ceramic poppies which was part of the 'Blood Swept Lands and Sea of Red Installation' at the Tower of London in 2014 is now on permanent display in the Church Vestibule. This specially mounted poppy together with its certificate has been kindly donated to the congregation by Mr Kenneth Brodie, son of the late Malcolm Brodie whose connection with Cregagh goes back many years. We would thank Kenneth and the Brodie Family for this gesture.

The display at the Tower of London was created by Paul Cummins and Tom Piper and 888,246 ceramic poppies were used – each poppy represented a British military family fatality during the 1914/18 war. When the display was dismantled all the poppies were sold, raising millions of pounds which were shared equally amongst sis service charities.
