The Moderator of the General Assembly, Right Rev Dr William Henry has requested PCI congregations and members to pray and consider the legislation passed at Westminster which has the power to bring about profound change to Northern Ireland. This includes the liberation of abortion laws here unless the Assembly is restored and an Executive formed on, or before, 21<sup>st</sup> October. A silent protest about planned liberalisation of abortion will take place on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> September at 7.00 p.m. at Stormont Estate.
