CHRISTMAS EVE IN CREGAGH

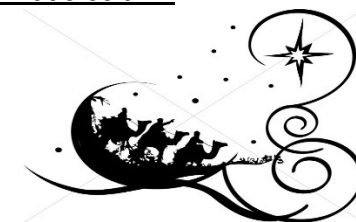
TUESDAY 24th DECEMBER at 11.30 p.m.
