#### **RECYCLING IN CREGAGH!**

"Just a wee reminder of what can go into the recycling bins and how to place the items. ## **REV McKENZIE – ARMY CHAPLAIN**

Upon being accepted into the Army Reserves our Minister was commissioned as a Chaplain, wearing the rank of Captain. This commission is probationary and is only confirmed upon the successful completion of a series of training courses and meeting of certain standards. This must be achieved within a two-year period. This training includes four weeks at the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst. Rev McKenzie previously completed a fortnight in the winter and now returns to face the remaining two weeks. The course will be demanding mentally and physically, and he is very thankful for the prayers of the church family. This has been his ambition since his early teenage years, and he is humbled and grateful for the members of Cregagh who have encouraged him to see it through. It would be his hope that the congregation would be proud, in the right sense of the word, if he is successful in passing this final stage
