ORDER OF SERVICE

**The following may help our visitors to share in the services:-

** The Processional and Recessional hymns are not announced – the numbers are on the hymnboards – hymnbooks and bibles are in the pews for your use.

** Please stand (if able) as the service begins when the Bible is carried into church and the Minister or Speaker and Choir enter, and remain standing until the Minister or Speaker says "Let us pray"

** This morning the Offering is after the Sermon and is unannouced.

** This evening the Offering and collection of Communion Tokens is announced. ** This morning please stand as the collectors bring the Offering to the Sanctuary for dedication, and remain standing until after the Recessional hymn, the Speaker and Choir leave and the Bible is carried from church.

** This evening please stand as the Elders bring the Offering and Communion Tokens to the Sanctuary for dedication and remain standing for the pre-communion hymn.

** At the end of the evening Communion service please remain standing for the Recessional hymn and the Elders remove the Elements, the Minister and Choir leave and the Bible is carried out from church.
